

Short-term Student Exchange Program (2019) **(GSID, Nagoya University–Royal University of Law and Economics)**

1. Background and Objectives

Nagoya University started “Fostering Human Resources for Global Soft-Infrastructure connecting between ASEAN and Japan” as an Inter-university Exchange Project supported by Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology in 2016. The program aims to foster human resources who can contribute to establishing relationships between Japan and ASEAN countries, especially Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, and Vietnam, and to play vital roles in multinational companies and public institutions. For these purposes, Nagoya University has established a consortium with Royal University of Phnom Penh, Royal University of Agriculture (Cambodia), National University of Laos, University of Yangon (Myanmar), Foreign Trade University (Vietnam), and National University of Singapore to strengthen participants’ mutual understanding through short-term and long-term overseas studies.

As a part of the program, the Graduate School of International Development (GSID) is going to host short-term student exchange program (with credit) for two students from Royal University of Law and Economics (RULE) in academic year 2019 (Fall Semester). The student is expected to play an important role to connect Cambodia and Japan in the future.

Appendix II JASSO Scholarship

JASSO offers a scholarship for qualified international students who are accepted by a Japanese university under a student exchange agreement or other student exchange arrangement on a short-term basis from 8 days to one year between Japanese school and their home higher educational institution outside Japan.

Scholarship Qualification (FY2019)

- A. The applicants are expected to have a minimum JASSO grade point average of 2.30.
- If their JASSO grade point average is 2.00-2.30 or it is not possible to submit an official transcript, they need to submit relevant documents which demonstrate their high academic achievement.
 - Those who have JASSO grade point average below 2.00 cannot apply for the scholarship.

JASSO grade point average formula:

$$\frac{([\text{Number of GP3 credits}] \times 3) + ([\text{Number of GP2 credits}] \times 2) + ([\text{Number of GP1 credits}] \times 1) + ([\text{Number of GP0 credits}] \times 0)}{\text{Total number of credits}}$$

Example:

JASSO grade point average: $36 / 15 = 2.40$

- B. The applicants must complete their studies at their attending school after the completion of the overseas study program in Japan.
